## GOLF TOURNAMENT

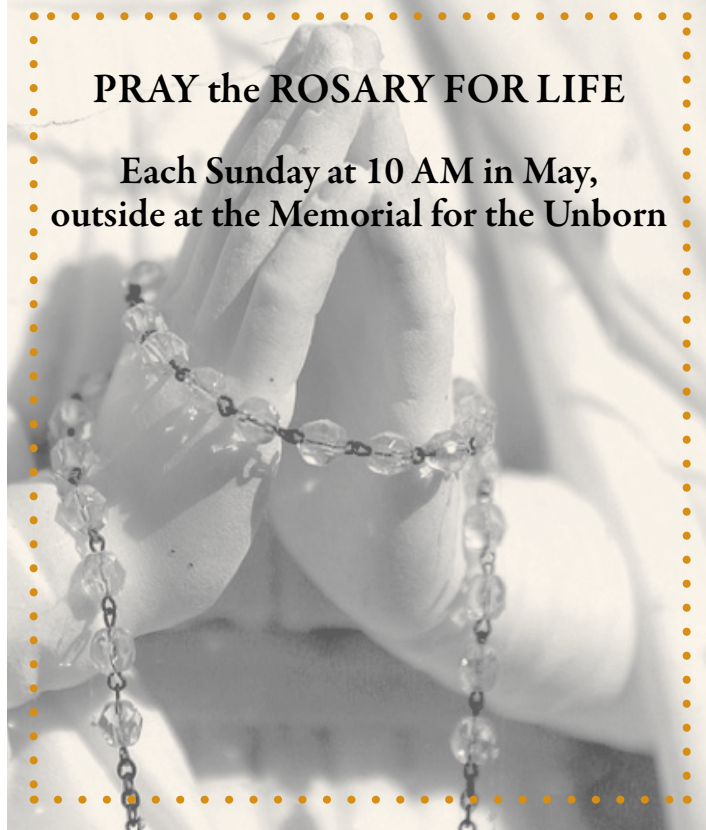

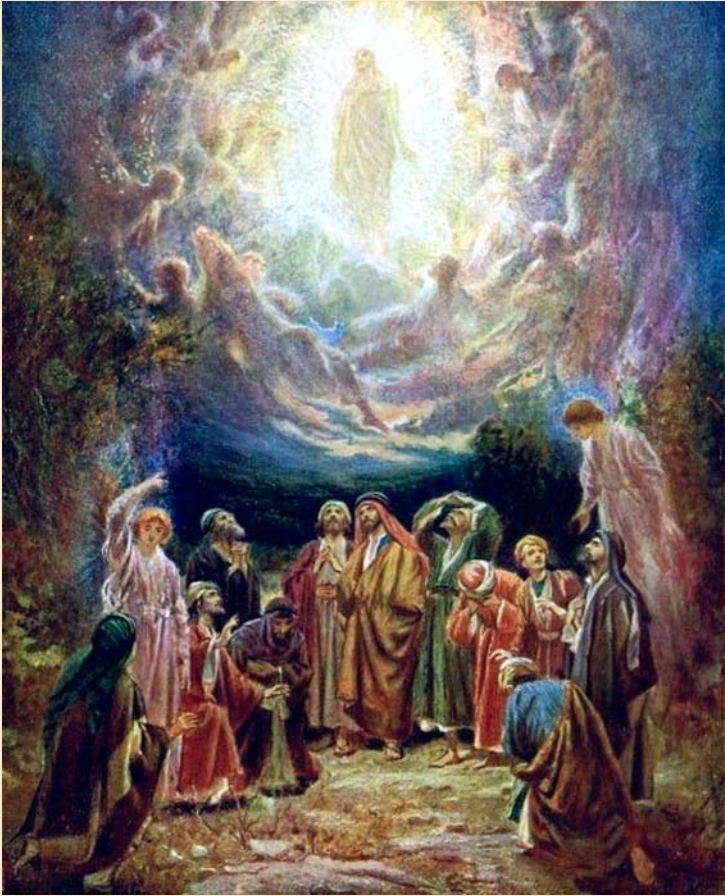

## REFLECTIONS ON THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD, JESUS CHRIST



Imagine the apostles looking on as their Master, Teacher and Savior whom they had spent so much time with, vanished from their sight and ascended into heaven. For only days ago they faced with great fear what appeared to be an insurmountable catastrophe when the Son of Man was cruelly put to death. Yet, the dark tears of fear were broken, light shone forth; the Lord stood among them and, after promising to send the Holy Spirit, vanished into the heavens on a cloud! What intense vibrations of love and wonder must have resounded in the apostles' hearts.

We too, in a sense, can stand with the apostles, looking heavenward to that place where our Lord ascended. We, too, can experience that fiery wonder deep within which transforms fear and tragedy, insecurity and tension into a bright, peaceful certainty that floods the heart with loving warmth from God.

And, as we stand looking into the eternal depths of the sky, not seeing our Lord, yet knowing by faith where he is and that he resides in our hearts, we have no need to worry over those circumstances of life which drive thorns of pain deep within us, for all things are passing. Christ has risen. Indeed, our Lord has risen! He has ascended into heaven where he appears "in the presence of God on our behalf."

"And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself." The lifting up of Jesus on the cross signifies and announces his lifting up by his Ascension into heaven, and indeed begins it. Jesus Christ, the one priest of the new and eternal Covenant, "entered, not into a sanctuary made by human hands. . . but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf." There Christ permanently exercises his priesthood, for he "always lives to make intercession" for "those who draw near to God through him." As "high priest of the good things to come" he is the center and the principal actor of the liturgy that honors the Father in heaven. (CCC No. 662).



**STROKE IS THE THIRD LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH IN THE UNITED STATES.** It is also a leading cause of serious long-term disability. Although most strokes occur in people aged 65 or older, strokes can occur at any age. Knowing the symptoms of stroke and calling 9-1-1 immediately if someone appears to be having a stroke are important steps in getting quick emergency medical care for a stroke. New treatments are offered that can reduce the damage caused by a stroke for some victims, but these treatments need to be given soon after the symptoms start.

**KNOW THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF STROKE**

**SUDDEN**

- Numbness or weakness of the face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Confusion, trouble speaking or understanding
- Trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Trouble walking, dizziness, or loss of balance and coordination
- Severe headache with no known cause

**If you think someone is having a stroke, call 9-1-1 or emergency medical services immediately. Receiving immediate treatment is important in lowering the risk of disability and even death.**

**WHAT CAN YOU DO TO LOWER YOUR CHANCE OF HAVING A STROKE?**


Knowing your chances of having a stroke then doing what you can to reduce or control those chances is the best approach to preventing stroke and stroke-related disability. Things you can do to lower your chances of having a stroke may include:

- Prevent and control high blood pressure
- Eat healthy diet
- Maintain a healthy weight
- Exercise

## 40 DAYS FOR LIFE

**40 Days for Life is a pro-life campaign with a vision to access God's power through prayer, fasting, & peaceful vigil to end abortion in America. Since 40 Days for Life began in 2004, over 5545 babies have been spared, over 21 abortion clinics have closed & over 61 abortion workers have quit their jobs & walked away from the abortion industry.**

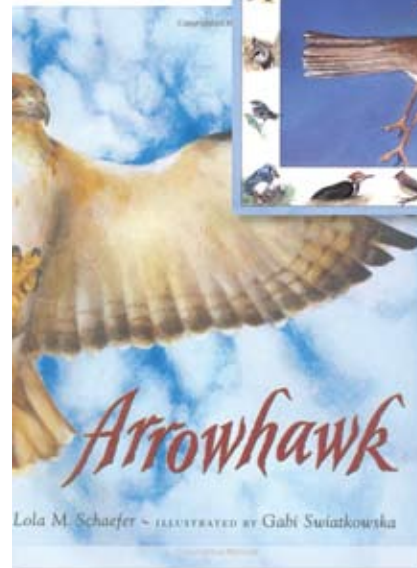
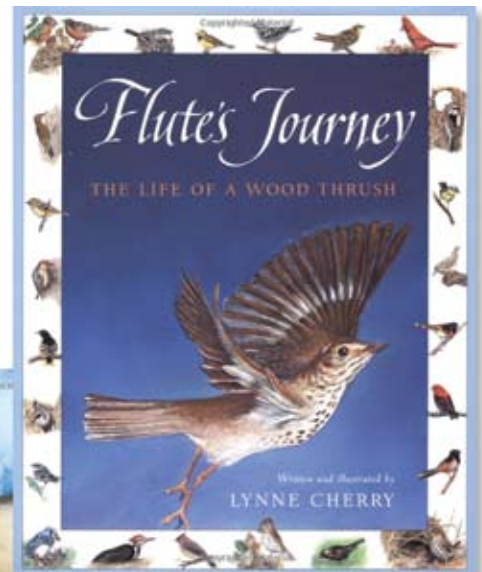
## booknook

Last week, MAY 12, we celebrated BIRD MIGRATION DAY. Many birds and some other animals leave one location and travel (sometimes even thousands of miles) to other places. Usually they travel north in the spring & summer. Here they find plenty of food and have their babies. Then they migrate south in fall and winter where the weather will be better and there will be more food. This is the time of year when all of us can help these birds in many ways – take injured animals to a wildlife rehabilitator, provide bird houses and provide extra food. Catholics are becoming more and more concerned with the needs of God's creatures and how we can help them.

Here are two of the many books the library has about birds.

FLUTE'S JOURNEY by Lynne Cherry. Following a young wood thrush from his birth in Maryland to his winter home in Costa Rica, this book tells the story of bird migration from the bird's point of view.

ARROWHAWK by Lois Schaefer. Based on a true story which is included at the back of the book. ARROWHAWK is about an immature hawk that was shot by a poacher. He survived the initial injury and spends several weeks living with the arrow in his body. He is captured, treated, and then released by a group of wildlife rehabilitators.

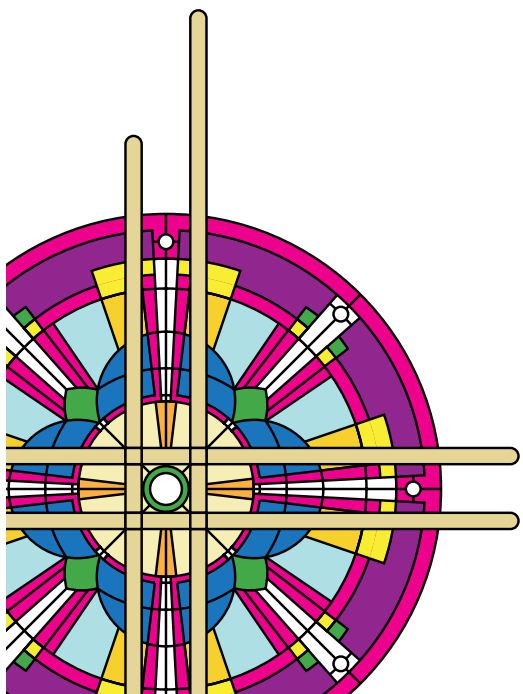
